



## **EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM**

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) work with other military and civilian agencies to provide a comprehensive, coordinated, multi-agency approach for community support, housing, medical education, and personnel services to Families with special needs. This is accomplished through the following services:

- Family support Services & Counseling
- Medical & Educations Information and Referral
- Enrollment and Relocation Assistance
- Advocacy: Services, Accessibility and Housing
- Support Group
- Recreational Activities and Summer Camp Grants
- EFMP Coordinating Committee
- Special Needs Accommodation Process
- Respite Care Referrals

An exceptional family member is a Family Member with any physical, emotional, developmental, or intellectual disorder that requires special treatment, therapy, education training or counseling.

The following Soldiers with exceptional Family Members must enroll in the program:

- Active Army
- U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) soldiers in the Active Guard Reserve program and other USAR Soldiers on active duty exceeding 30 days.
- Army National Guard (GR) personnel serving under authority of title 10, United States Code.

To enroll in the program the soldier should contact the nearest Army military treatment facility EFMP point of contact.
